

Cisco Webex Privacy Policy

We use Cisco WebEx, a service for online meetings and video conferencing. The service provider is the American company Cisco Systems, Inc, Legal Department, 170 West Tasman Dr, San Jose, CA 95134 USA. More information about the data processed through Cisco WebEx can be found in the Privacy Policy at <https://www.cisco.com/c/en/us/about/legal/privacy-full.html>.

Method and purpose of processing:

We use the provider Cisco WebEx to conduct videoconferences. The invitation to a videoconference takes place via the communication of a meeting link. For data protection, we use end-to-end encryption. This requires the installation of the Cisco WebEx app. By using Cisco WebEx for video conferencing, we do not process any personal data ourselves. The provider Cisco Systems (from now on "Cisco") automatically collects information when you participate in video conferences, as required to provide the video conferencing service. These are, e.g., your IP address, username, and the duration of the video conference.

Legal basis: Consent of the participant

The processing of data is based on the participant's consent (Art. 6 para. 1 lit. a GDPR). The consent is declared – at least implied – by the <https://trustportal.cisco.com/c/dam/r/ctp/docs/privacydatasheet/collaboration/cisco-webexmeetings-privacy-data-sheet.pdf> participation in the video conference.

We expressly point this out when sending the meeting link.

Without consent, participation is not possible.

Recipient:

The recipient of the data is Cisco as the order processor. For this purpose, we have concluded the corresponding order processing agreement with Cisco.

Storage period and revocation of consent:

By using Cisco WebEx for video conferencing, we do not collect and store any personal data ourselves. You can revoke your consent at any time with effect for the future, e.g., by emailing dsb@humangenetik-tuebingen.de.

Third-country transfer:

For the Cisco WebEx version, user data is stored in European data centers, so there is no third-country transfer.

Order processing agreement according to Art. 28 GDPR

We have concluded an order processing agreement with Cisco as our service provider in accordance with Art. 28 GDPR. Since a transfer of data to the USA cannot be ruled out, we have concluded standard contractual clauses with Cisco pursuant to Art. 46 (2) GDPR, on the one hand (see https://www.cisco.com/c/dam/en_us/about/doing_business/legal/docs/mdpa-for-supplier-portal.pdf) and on the other hand, Cisco itself has implemented binding internal data protection regulations in accordance with Art. 47 GDPR, which European data protection authorities have approved. Cisco additionally guarantees extensive data protection for using Cisco Webex (<https://gblogs.cisco.com/de/datenschutz-ist-ein-grundrecht-cisco-webex/>). Therefore, we assume that the use of Cisco Webex meets the requirements for an adequate level of data protection.
